1 Introduction

The eZscan device is powered by the Windows 7 Embedded SP1 operating system.

1.1 Patent

The eZscan® device is covered by following patents: "Electrophysiological analysis system and method" (Patent 1 898 783 and 2 124 736), and "Procédé d'analyse physiologique par stabilisation d'une surtension" (PCT2014/069479).

1.2 Use

EZSCAN is a medical device for the early detection of peripheral autonomic neuropathy in order to screen for subjects at higher risk of diabetes or cardiometabolic disease (including prediabetes). It's an alternative method for screening of risk.

1.3 Principle

EZSCAN measures the capacity of the sweat glands to release chloride ions in response to an electric stimulus. It is a dynamic test equivalent to a stress test.

Description:

The eZscan device consists of the following:

- A control panel and display
- A pair of foot sensor plates
- A pair of hand sensor plates
- A power cable

1.4 Installation


Carefully follow instructions in the corresponding manual to ensure correct installation. Complete installation should take no more than 15-20 minutes.

2 Power up the system

- 1 In front of the system, there are 2 USB ports and power button.
- 2 Press and release the power button to power on.




Figure 1 : Home page – no user logged in

- 1 Click on the Log in button. The "Log in" panel appears (ref. p9).
- 2 Click on Quality Check to launch the system "Quality check" (ref. p13).
- 3 Click on **Shut down** to shut down the system.





5 Quality check page

5.1 Overview

The Quality Check allows the operator to test the internal electronic circuitry of the system.

5.2 List of controls




Figure 5 : Quality Check page – empty

- Click on the hands (left) and feet (right) Electrode test buttons to check the connectivity with the electrodes. The appropriate electrode LED will light up if the connectivity is Ok.
- 2 Enter an Operator name to be displayed in the Quality Check report.
 - if the Operator name is not set, the Physician's name is displayed in the Quality Check report instead
- 3 Click on the <u>Run test</u> button to execute a full Quality Check sequence (ref. p15 for Quality Check results interpretation).



The electrodes must be carried out without patient (nobody on contact with the electrodes).

5.3 During a Quality Check test




Figure 6: Quality Check page -During the Quality Check

1 Click on the <u>Cancel test</u> button to stop the Quality Check test.

NOTE: It may take up to several minutes for the test to cancel.

5.4 Quality Check result interpretation

When the Quality Check is complete and no error occurred, green checks are displayed for every lines as follows:

- 1 Click on the Print button to print and export the Quality Check report.
- 2 Click on the <u>More details</u> button to display more information regarding to the Quality Check results.

5.5 To have more details on the Quality Check results

When an error occurred during the execution of a Quality Check, you can display more information by clicking on the <u>More Details</u> button to know the error source.

NOTE

Some of these information are only available for supervisor users.




Figure 9: Quality Check page -More details on the Quality check results




Figure 10 : Configuration page




Figure 11: Standard users - Additional settings




Figure 12: Configuration page - Additional controls for supervisor




Figure 13: Supervisor users - Configuration (2) page

- 1 Select the physician whose settings will be modified.
- 2 Set the password for the selected physician and click on "Save Password".
- 3 Select the time delay before the system locks itself and you are logged out the application.
- 4 Select the frequency for Quality Check (a remainder will pop up if no Quality Check is run in the time specified).
- 5 Change the print settings for the selected physician:
 - Check "Direct print" to display results and automatically print the reports after a successful scan. (Preferred setting)
 - Uncheck "Direct print" to display the results only. End user can select manual print from the report screen (ref. p53) or for patients' history (ref. p39).
- 6 Change the mouse cursor settings:
 - Check the box to hide the mouse cursor
 - Uncheck the box in case you want to use a physical mouse.
- 7 Change the report settings for the selected physician:
 - Activate or deactivate the display of reports for the previous exams (when existing)

8 Select the date format to apply for the selected physician.

Default mode is DD/MM/YYYY.

- 9 Select optional data for the selected physician (all options may not be available)
 - When "Date of birth" is not checked, only the Year of birth is required.
- 10 Change data management settings:
 - Enable the patient modification to allow standard users to modify demographic data for their patients.
 - Enable the display of mean conductances on the Result screen and the report.
- 11 Select the preferred measurement format (linked to the selected physician).
 - kg or lb (weight)
 - cm or ft/in (height)
 - cm or inches (waist)

By default the application displays height in centimeters (cm) and weight in kilograms (kg).

Click on Services tab to access to additional services (ref. p23).

Click on Interpretation messages to modify messages that appear as interpretation on the Results screen and on the reports. (ref. p25)




Figure 14: Services page - Additional supervisor services

- 1 Select the physician whose settings will be modified.
- 2 Click on Import button to import data for the selected physician (ref. p26).
- 3 Select patients from the list. To do so, some tools are available:
 - A filter on patients' name, first name, year of birth and patient identifier (PID)
 - A filter on dates ("from" and "to" dates)
 - A control to select/unselect all patients from the list
- 4 Select exams from the exam list. To do so, some tools are available:
 - A filter on dates ("from" and "to" dates)
 - A control to select/unselect all exams from the list
- When at least one patient is selected, click on <u>Edit button</u> to modify the data attached to the selected patient(s) (*ref. p31*).
- 6 Click on Export button to export data attached to the selected patient(s) and exam(s) (ref. p29).

6.6 Supervisor users – Interpretation messages

The eZscan software is used to screen potential risk of diabetes or cardiometabolic disease. The computed scores are used to display the level of the potential risk and some explanation about the situation. The messages that are used in each situation can be modified by any user with supervisor privileges.




Figure 15: Modify interpretation messages

- Select the physician whose settings will be modified from Configuration (ref. p20), Configuration (2) (ref. p21), or Services (ref. p23).
- 2 Select the type of message you want to modify and modify the content. The new content is saved automatically.




You can select several type of data:

- Import DB files: these are the raw data on old Impeto systems (2.xx version).
- Import Raw files: these are the raw data on Impeto systems since 3.1 version.
- <u>Import a list of patients from a CSV files</u> use the proposed template to ensure compatibility with the system (ref. p63).
- Import all data from an old system via USB key (auto): Import automatically data from older systems from a USB key. This option is only available if the database from the system is empty.






6.8 Export data on a USB key for a selected physician

1 Insert a virus free USB key containing enough free space (100 scans ~ 25MB).




2 Select patient(s), exam(s) (ref. p40) and click on Export button. A popup window appears to precise the type of data you want to export:



You can select several type of data:

- <u>Compile and export a CSV file:</u> including all data for the selected exams. The encryption of patients' names and first names is optional (reversible, irreversible or none).
 - Stored within a /CompiledCSV/ folder on the USB key.
- <u>Export Raw files:</u> These are the raw data, useful to switch from one Impeto system to another.
 - Stored within a /ExportRaw/ folder on the USB.

3 Validate and verify that the USB key is correctly plugged into the system:



4 Validate and the files are exported:



5 The export is complete.



NOTE

When the export is complete, the data are on the USB key. For the RAW files export, when a file is missing, a file (MissingFiles.txt) is created on the USB key and contains the list of missing files.




6.9 Patient reconciliation & Patient demographic data modification

This feature is also available for standard users when it has been enabled by a supervisor (option "Enable patient modification", ref. p19).


Select one or several patients (ref. p40) and click on the Edit button.




When only one patient is selected, a popup window is displayed to modify demographic data of the selected patient (name, first name, date of birth, patient ID):



When several patients are selected, a popup window is displayed to gather several patients under one:




4 Select the patients to gather from the list on the left, and the referent patient from the list on the right:



Click on Ok to validate, and all the data for the patients to gather will be combined and updated with demographic data from the referent patient.

The list of patient is then updated on the Services screen.



7 Scan pages

When a patient does not exist already on the system, select <u>New Patient</u> button on the Home screen *(ref. p8)* and fill in demographic data for the patient.

7.1 List of controls

After entering the mandatory patient data indicated by an *, the <u>Scan</u> button becomes available and the user can start a scan (ref. p35 to setup patient's demographic information and start a scan).

Required data changes according to enabled options.

2 Click on <u>Clear patient data</u> to clear all patient data fields.

7.1.1 Other controls

Click on the Home button (1) to go to the home page (ref. p8).

Click on the Help button (?) to directly lead you to the specific topic that is displayed on the screen within the User Manual.

7.2 Patient setup & start a scan

1 Set the patient's demographic information.

Enter data by clicking on the corresponding text boxes, which will make the on-screen keyboard appear:

- <u>Last Name</u> and/or <u>Patient ID</u> (IDENTITY CODE)
- First name
- <u>Age</u> or <u>Date of birth</u> (10 to 109 years). This option can be modified by a supervisor (ref. p21)
- Select the appropriate <u>Gender</u>
- Weight (10 to 199 kg OR 22 to 438 lbs)
- Height (100 to 249 cm OR 3 ft 3 ins to 8 ft)
- <u>HbA1c</u> (x10, 40 to 199 mmol/mol).
- <u>SBP/DBP</u> (8 to 400 mmHg). **This option can be changed by a supervisor (ref. p21).**
- Enter comments in the <u>Additional comments</u> field if necessary.

NOTE

It is also possible to use any standard PC-type keyboard connected to one of the USB connections available on the Master Unit.

NOTE

Verify the data with your patient. Invalid (out of acceptable range) or missing data will be flagged with a RED background and patient data should be re-entered.

2 If all required fields have been entered, then the scan button turns green as follows:



If all required fields have not been entered, then the scan button is greyed out and cannot be selected:



The use of USB ports during the scan can lead to a system blocking issue. Please, do not try to plug or unplug USB device on the system during the scan.

3 If all required fields have not been entered and the <u>Scan</u> button is selected, then any missing fields will be highlighted in red.




Figure 17: Scan page - Highlighting of empty required fields

3 Click on the Scan button to start the scan (ref. p37).



THE PATIENT MUST NOT TOUCH THE MASTER UNIT. DO NOT TOUCH THE PATIENT DURING THE SCAN.

7.3 What if the scan cannot be launched

If you filled in all information about the patient but the scan still cannot be launched:

- Please check that the sensor plates are correctly inserted within their dock respectively (ref. p56 to see how to insert a sensor plate within a dock). Also, check that the sensor plates were not inverted between hands and feet docks.
- Please check that the dock are correctly plugged on the system and reboot the system.
- If the issue persists, please contact **Impeto Medical** technical services

NOTE

Red LEDS on the docks indicates that the scan cannot be launched. If the issue persists after you followed the procedure above, please contact **Impeto Medical** Technical Services (ref. p79).

7.4 During the scan

1 The application displays a video and a progress bar during the scan. With smart electrodes, the scan progression is also described by the LED that are lighted progressively, from bottom to top, on each docks (hands and feet).

NOTE

A calibration is performed at the beginning of each scan. The patient is requested to remain still during the scan.




Figure 18: Acquisition

2 If hand or foot contact on the sensor plates is lost during calibration, then an error message will appear on the screen.



- 3 The scan can be cancelled at any time by selecting the <a>Stop scan button.
- 4 Scan completion is confirmed by a double-bell sound (unless muted).
 - Upon successful completion of the scan, the scan number (#) will increase by 1 and the remaining scans will decrease by 1, as shown in the upper right hand corner of the screen. The result page is displayed once the scan successfully ends (ref. p48).
 - When the scan ends with an issue, the application processes to the result page but the remaining scans will not decrease by 1, except if the scan is validated by the user (ref. p49)
- 5 Clean the electrodes after each scan with manufacturer approved cleaning solution (ref. p55).

8 Patient History page

To retrieve data for exams and patients, click on the <u>Patient History</u> button from the Home screen (ref. p8).




Figure 19 : Patient History page

- Select patients from the <u>Patient list</u> and exams from the <u>Exam list</u> (ref. p40).
- When available, edit patient demographic data or combine data from several patients by clicking on the Edit button. The option can be enabled by supervisor users (ref. p21).
- 3 Start a New scan for the selected patient (ref. p34).
- 4 Display the results for the selected exam (ref. p48).
- 5 Display the follow-up screen for the selected exams (ref. p43).
- 6 Export or print data and reports for the selected exams (ref. p45).




8.2 Selection of patient(s) and exam(s)

To select a patient or an exam, select the corresponding checkbox.


Use the patient filter to filter the patient list on name, first name, year of birth or patient ID.



Select the patient(s) from the patient list.



Use the filter on dates to display exams for a precise date (here September 18th, 2013)



The patients that were selected are still selected but separated in two categories whether they have exams corresponding to the date filter ("Filtered patients") or not ("Selected patients").

Then, the list of exam is updated according to the date filter.

8.3 How to start a new scan for a patient

Select a patient (only one) and click on the New scan button (ref. p34):




Figure 20: Start a new scan for an existing patient

Select an exam (only one) from the list of exams and click on the Scan results button (ref. p48):





Figure 21: Display results for an exam

8.5 How to display the follow-up for a patient

Select several exams for a patient and click on Follow-up button:



The follow-up of a patient is displayed when at least 2 exams are selected for the same patient and it is possible to display up to 15 exams.




The follow-up screen is displayed.



The top graph describes the eZscan score evolution. It is possible to display the score values by clicking on the curve.

The bottom graph describes the evolution of the Body Mass Index (BMI).

Click on the Print button to print the follow-up report:



The PDF report is generated and stored within the system. To print the report physically, ensure that a printer has been selected and click on the print button.







9.2 Results

The eZscan device immediately populates results after a scan. The score is computed using demographic data and measured Galvanic Skin Response for each extremity. The results are expressed as a risk score (from 0 to 100), the BMI value in kg/m², and when activated (ref. p21 for supervisor settings) skin mean conductances measured in micro Siemens (μ S). Results should be interpreted by a physician and take into account the patient's clinical history.

9.2.1 Quality of Measure

If the patient moves during the scan, the following message appears on the screen:



The user is given the opportunity to accept the results or re-scan the patient. Selecting <u>Accept</u> will include the current results in the patient's follow-up. The reports will be generated with a mention that the patient moved during scan and that results may be affected.

Selecting **Re-Scan** will return the user to the scan page to start a new scan.


NOTE

Electrodes must be cleaned before re-scanning the patient with manufacturer approved cleaning solution.

NOTE

When performing a Re-Scan, the number of remaining scans will not be decreased until the user accepts the scan results or the scan is performed without error.

During the scan, if the patient is either grounded (touched during the scan), or if an internal issue occurs, the following message will appear:



After selecting the <u>Re-Scan</u> button, the current scan will be cancelled. The user will return to the scan page to start a new scan. If the issue persists, please contact **Impeto Medical** Technical Support (ref. p79).

NOTE

When performing a Re-Scan, the number of remaining scans will not be decreased until the user accepts the scan results or the scan is performed without error.

9.3 Quick interpretation of the results

9.3.1 Disclaimer

EZSCAN is a medical device for the early detection of peripheral autonomic neuropathy in order to screen for subjects at higher risk of diabetes or cardiometabolic disease (including prediabetes). It's an alternative method for screening of risk.

The device measures the capacity of the sweat glands to release chloride ions in response to an electrochemical stimulus on the palms of the hands and soles of the feet. Test results are provided as a risk score (4 risk levels illustrated in color-coded format easily understood by the patient: no risk, moderate risk, high risk, very high risk). When a risk is evidenced more specific tests are recommended for a precise diagnosis.

9.3.2 Low risk




Figure 23: eZscan score with a low risk

The results of the scan show a low risk. The recommendations are to plan a new eZscan test in 12 months.

9.3.3 Moderate risk




Figure 24: eZscan score with a moderate risk

The results of the scan show a moderate risk. Recommendation for lifestyle improvement (diet and/or exercise). Plan a new eZscan test in 6 months.

9.3.4 High risk




Figure 25: eZscan score with a high risk




Figure 26: eZscan score with a very high risk




Figure 27: EZscan report page




Figure 28: Add comments on reports

11 Cleaning the sensor plates



IMPORTANT

Immediately after each scan, it is important to clean all sensor plates with the manufacturer approved cleaning solution.

This will not only disinfect but neutralize the electrochemical reactions which have taken place on the sensor plates during the scan. Additionally, this stops the corrosion process which would otherwise quickly damage the sensor plates' surface.



- 1 Deposit only a small quantity of cleaning product on each sensor plate.
- 2 Wipe sensor plates until dry.

Use a new sheet for each sensor plate.



IMPORTANT

Strictly adhere to cleaning product instructions for use and precaution.

12 Replace the electrodes

Before launching a scan (ref. p35), the number of available scans appears on the top right corner of the screen. The scan number (#) will increase by one and the number of remaining scans will decrease by one upon successful completion of a scan.

Also, the number of remaining scans is described by the lighted LEDS on each docks.

12.2 How to replace Sensor Plates

Impeto Medical will ship a set of sensor plates that will be used to replace the sensor plates once all scans have been used.

When there are no scans left, the system prevents the user to start more scans:




Figure 32: Scan page - Change sensor plates.

Once you have received a new set of sensor plates, follow the instructions to replace them:





After the change of sensor plate, return to the main screen of the software, then click the <u>New Patient</u> button. The remaining number of scans, displayed in the top right corner of the screen, is then updated.

IF THE DOCK HAS BEEN DISCONNECTED FROM THE SYSTEM, PLEASE PLUG IT BACK AND RESTART THE SYSTEM. THE REPLACEMENT OF THE SENSOR PLATES DOES NOT REQUIRE TO DISCONNECT THE DOCKS FROM THE SYSTEM, NOR TO RESTART THE SYSTEM WHEN THE PROCEDURE IS COMPLETED.

NOTE

After a change of sensor plate, the first scan performed "pairs" the sensor plate with the dock in which it has been inserted. It is then no longer possible to use the sensor plate with another dock. Sensor plates must be replaced after all the scans have been used.

13 USB printer drivers installation

To install USB Printer drivers, you must be logged in as a Supervisor. In Tools & Settings, access the Windows Desktop (ref. p20).

15 Troubleshoot the system

15.1 USB connection

The following message can appear on top of the screen:

*impetomedical v3

This means that the connection between the application and the hardware has been lost. It will not be possible to perform any scan in that situation.

To solve the issue:

- 1 Reboot the system.
- 2 If the problem is not solved, contact your distributor or Impeto Medical (cf. p79).

15.2 Test the hardware

The Quality Check controls the proper functioning of the device. It should be done regularly (cf. p13).

If an error occurs during normal use of the device, try to launch a Quality Check. If the test is negative and you still encounter issues, please contact your distributor or **Impeto Medical** (cf. p79).

15.3 Issue with the sensor plates

If the sensor plate docks show red leds, it means that there is an issue and that the scan cannot be launched.

18 Precaution of use and technical specifications

Principle of EZSCAN device

Low voltage is applied to sensor plates in contact with the hands and feet, areas with the highest sweat gland density. The electrical current stresses the sweat glands which, in response, release chloride ions (Cl-).

At low voltage, the stratum corneum acts as a capacitor and only the sweat ducts allow the transmission of ions from the skin to the sensor plates. This ensures that the measurements taken correspond solely to the sweat gland function.

There is an observable electrochemical reaction between the CI- ions and the anode.

The device records the electrochemical conductance related to the concentration of the chloride ions from the sweat glands and detected by the sensor plates (on the hands and feet).

The EZSCAN device is composed of a EZSCAN software integrated into a touch-screen Windows 7 PC computer and connected to 4 sensor plates placed on the feet, the hands.

General operation of EZSCAN

The patient positions his bare feet on the feet sensor plates, applies the palms of his hands to the hands sensor plates.

After entering the patient demographic information (last name, first name, age, gender, height, weight), the operator will initiate the software and activate the electronic circuitry of the device, which will then apply DC voltage to the sensor plate and will measure the current passing through the sensor plates.

Several successive cycles of measurements are carried out in an automatic way and all the measured values are recorded on the hard disk. Data-processing is then performed to compute the conductance on each sensor plate.

At the end of the measurement cycle, which lasts approximately 3 minutes, the user can see the displayed patient report on the screen and also has the option of printing out a hard copy of the report. No control is accessible to the patient, and the use of the EZSCAN system is strictly reserved for physician use in a healthcare setting.

Precautions of use and maintenance

Transport

If it is necessary to pack, to transport or deliver EZSCAN after its use, it is recommended to arrange all its elements in their housing and position of origin.

Pay particular attention to carefully arrange the sensor plate cables in the locations especially designed for them in the protection foams, not to damage or weaken them.

The EZSCAN box can be stored upright or laid down.

The EZSCAN device does not comprise any accumulator.



Recycling

At the end of its lifetime, the EZSCAN device must be returned to **Impeto Medical**'s authorized distributor, which will return it to **Impeto Medical**, in order to ensure the recycling of certain components.

The components and the accessories of the EZSCAN device are free of mercury and of components containing this element.

Protection against moisture



Do not use the EZSCAN device in a wet or damp environment.

The EZSCAN device is not protected from the effects of the discharges of an external defibrillator, nor against high frequency currents or strong electromagnetic disturbances. The use of mobile telephones or wireless fixed telephones can cause signal disturbances.

Electromagnetic compatibility



The use of portable and mobile RF communication devices (for example: cellular telephones) can influence the analysis carried out during the recording, as the recorded signals can be disturbed by electromagnetic interferences.

The device should not be used in the presence of ionizing radiations (x-rays, gamma rays ...) because those could erase the internal storage.

For the tables concerning the electromagnetic emissions and the immunity of the recorder, see the appendices of this handbook.

Maintenance of the device and sensor plates

No particular maintenance is necessary.

The external case and the cables of the sensor plates can be cleaned using a slightly wet tissue or soaked with soapy water. Do NOT use any detergent product, alcohol or acetone.

To avoid corrosion and ensuring the best conditions of hygiene, the feet and hands sensor plates must be cleaned immediately after each patient with an Impeto Medical approved cleaning solution.



ONLY PERSONEL AUTHORIZED BY IMPETO MEDICAL IS ALLOWED TO PERFORM ANY REPAIRS OR MAINTENANCE ON THE DEVICE (MAINTENANCE, CALIBRATION, ETC.).

All the technical documents (component part lists, descriptions, calibration instructions) are kept by Impeto Medical.

The warranty is null and void if the EZSCAN device was opened and repaired by any unauthorized person. Warranty will hold only against manufacturing defects and certainly not for any mechanical damage due to mishandlings or misuse. Refer to manual for proper use of the equipment.

Use and storage conditions

- Do not block the vents
- Do not use the device in a dusty environment
- Do not use the device in an oxygen-rich environment, with vapors or inflammable gas
- Keep the device away from any flammable source
- The device is not intended to be sterilized
- Use the device inside
- Use the device in a dry environment
- Maintain a minimum distance of 20 cm around the master unit



Use of the sensor plates

To ensure high quality recordings, particular care must be taken to the preparation of the skin of the patient and to the installation of the sensor plates.

It is also advisable to verify the sensor plate cable connectors are well inserted into the corresponding sockets at the rear of the EZSCAN Master Unit.



USE ONLY THE ORIGINAL SENSOR PLATES PROVIDED BY IMPETO MEDICAL.

Impeto Medical cannot guarantee the results of measurements carried out with sensor plates issued from other manufacturers.

When it is not in use, the EZSCAN device can be stored without disconnecting the sensor plate cables.

Positioning on the sensor plates

The patient must position the sole of his bare feet in the center of the feet sensor plates and firmly apply their hands flat in the center of the hands sensor plates.

Except in the event of significantly overweight patient, all scans will be performed with patient standing upright on the feet sensor plates.

Interrupting or stopping the recording

The test will automatically stop at the end of the measurements cycle, after approximately 3 minutes.

To stop the test BEFORE the end of the measurements cycle, select the <u>Cancel</u> button during the scan.

Recommendations to the operator

As for any medical examination, it is recommended to check the environmental conditions and the condition of the patient before carrying out a measurement:

- Room temperature is between 65 and 95 degrees Fahrenheit,
- Cardiac holter measurements going on can be altered during the 2 minutes time scan.

Contra-indications



The repeated use of the EZSCAN device does not create any side effect. However, it is advised not to proceed with measurements on the following patients:

- People with any open or bleeding wounds that would come into contact with the surface of the sensor plate,
- People with missing limbs,
- Pregnant women or women who are uncertain about a possible pregnancy.

Calibration

The EZSCAN device auto calibrates at the beginning of each test. The auto-calibration ensures that each sensor plate has enough contacts to proceed with the measurements.

If the calibration is interrupted, the operator is informed by an audible bell sound and/or an error message.

The customer or the user of the EZSCAN can help prevent electromagnetic interference by maintaining a minimum distance between portable and mobile RF communications equipment (transmitters) and the EZSCAN as recommended below, according to the maximum output power of the communications equipment.
